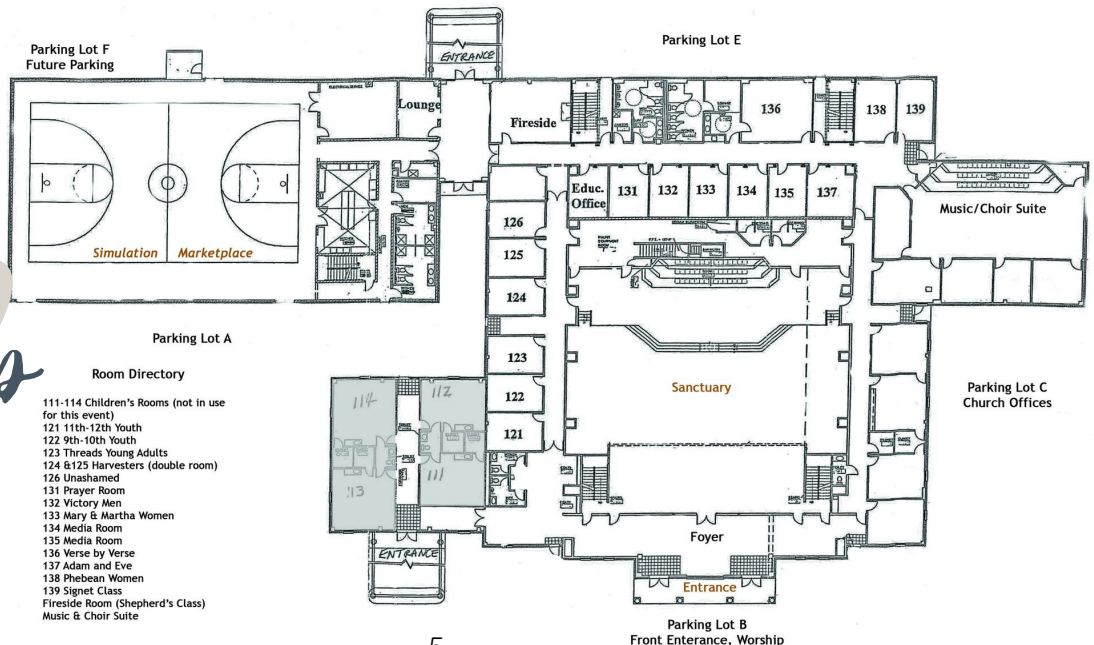

Stacey has served as a Mission Service Corps Missionary since June 2013. She directs a ministry to children and families which, in the past, has included a children's choir, family mission action projects, mission education for children, day camps, family movie nights, and much more.

In March 2020, when the pandemic forced their regular ministry activities to stop, Stacey found new adventures and new ways to reach her community. Working with five partnering churches, they began drive-thru dinners and, when these stopped, she focused on two housing areas where they continued to deliver meals.

Stacey ministers to ladies at a local rehab center, where she builds relationships, feeds them meals, and offers encouragement. Over the past couple of years, she has seen many of these ladies profess faith in Christ and follow through with baptism. Stacey helps to connect them to a local church and continues to disciple them in their new walk with the Lord.

On her 2021 KY-MSC ministry report, Stacey reported thirty professions of faith and twenty-five baptisms as a result of her ministry and/or personal witnessing.

Each year Stacey coordinates the Christmas Backpack program in Pulaski County, serving nearly one thousand local children. She works with other churches in the Lake Cumberland Baptist Association to create, organize, and/or maintain their preschool, children, and family ministries, and helps many of the smaller churches with Vacation Bible School.

Stacey left a career as a public-school teacher a few years ago to devote full-time to this ministry position. In addition to her ministry, she has adopted and fostered several children, some of which are now teenagers, and is leading them to be active in ministry.

Bro. Ed Amundson, Stacey's pastor at High Street Baptist Church in Somerset, has shared how valuable Stacey has been in leading their church and other churches in the Lake Cumberland Baptist Association to be on-mission in their local communities.

Stacey is most deserving of this award, which is given annually to a missionary that demonstrates:

- Commitment to and effectiveness in evangelism, church planting, or ministry.
- Demonstration of "going the second mile."
- Outstanding performance in achieving assigned tasks.
- Tenure
- Unusual commitment to our Lord's service.
- Positive representation of the Kentucky Baptist Convention.
- True reflection of being an "On Mission Christian."

Kentucky WMU, Inc. Bylaws

PART 1

ARTICLE I

Membership and Voting

Voting

INFORMATION

Section 1. Kentucky Woman's Missionary Union is comprised of the membership of WMU organizations in Kentucky Baptist Churches in cooperation with the Kentucky Baptist Convention.

As amended April 5, 2019

Section 2. Only members of local church WMU organizations may vote at meetings of Kentucky WMU.

ARTICLE III

Meetings of Members

Section 5. Kentucky Woman's Missionary Union members present in any session of an Annual or special meeting shall constitute the voting body. No proxy or cumulative voting shall exist.

Section 6. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the registered members.

ARTICLE IV

Executive Board

Section 1. The Executive Board shall be the board of directors of the corporation. Thirty persons shall constitute the Executive Board: the three officers, not including the Executive Director-Treasurer, three members from each of the eight geographical areas, a Royal Ambassadors/Challengers Representative appointed by the President to serve a term of up to three years, and by virtue of their offices, the President of the Baptist Nursing Fellowship and the Development Specialist.

As amended March 23, 2012

The members representing the geographical areas shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by the members in the annual meeting. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

1. A geographical area member shall be elected for a term of one year from annual meeting to annual meeting. She shall be eligible to serve a total of three full consecutive one year terms, except as provided in the following paragraph. Thereafter, she shall not be eligible for election to the Board until one year has elapsed from the last day of her service as a member of the Board.

As amended April 5, 2019

1. One Executive Board member from each area shall rotate off the Board each year. If a member is not subsequently elected to each of the three terms for which she is eligible, the person elected in her stead shall be eligible for reelection to additional consecutive terms according to the eligibility of her predecessor in office, thus maintaining the rotation.

1. In the event a vacancy occurs in an area position on the Board between Annual Meetings, the President may, in consultation with the Executive Director-Treasurer and the chairwoman of the Nominating Committee, appoint a person to fill the unexpired portion of the one year term.

ARTICLE VI

Parliamentary Authority

Kentucky Woman's Missionary Union shall use as its parliamentary authority Robert's Rules of Order, Revised.

INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS AND BOARD

Susan Bryant, former President of Kentucky WMU, gave a challenge to the newly-elected board and prayed for them. Susan emphasized the importance of the work that the board will do and the eternal significance it will have.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR-TREASURER AND PRESIDENT REPORT

Liz Encinia, Executive Director-Treasurer of Kentucky WMU, and Roetta Vaught, President of Kentucky WMU, presented their report to attendees. They reviewed how Kentucky WMU had continued to provide experiences and encouragement to learn, pray, give, and go during the Covid-19 pandemic. The 2020 Kentucky WMU Missions Celebration and Annual Meeting was offered as an online virtual experience since safety measures in response to the pandemic prevented large groups from gathering in person. Other online experiences such as camp, Women on Mission meetings, GA JAM, etc. followed throughout the year.

They shared some changes at the national WMU level, including a decision to sell the current building owned by National WMU in order to downsize for a more affordable working space. Also, National WMU is launching a new curriculum, Missions Journey: Kids, for children in Grades 1-6. This curriculum will replace the current offerings for Girls in Action, Royal Ambassadors, and Children in Action. Missions Journey: Kids may be used by any of these mission education groups as well as be incorporated into other children's discipleship groups.

Kentucky WMU also worked with Indiana WMU to offer the MK Re-entry Retreat, an important experience for Missionary Kids who are returning to the United States from international places of service to attend college. The retreat gives the students an opportunity reacclimate to the U.S. culture as they begin college.

Liz and Roetta reminded us through their report that "the mission matters most." We cannot let things like pandemics, financial struggles, or anything else keep us from fulfilling God's plan.

Roetta Vaught closed the business session.

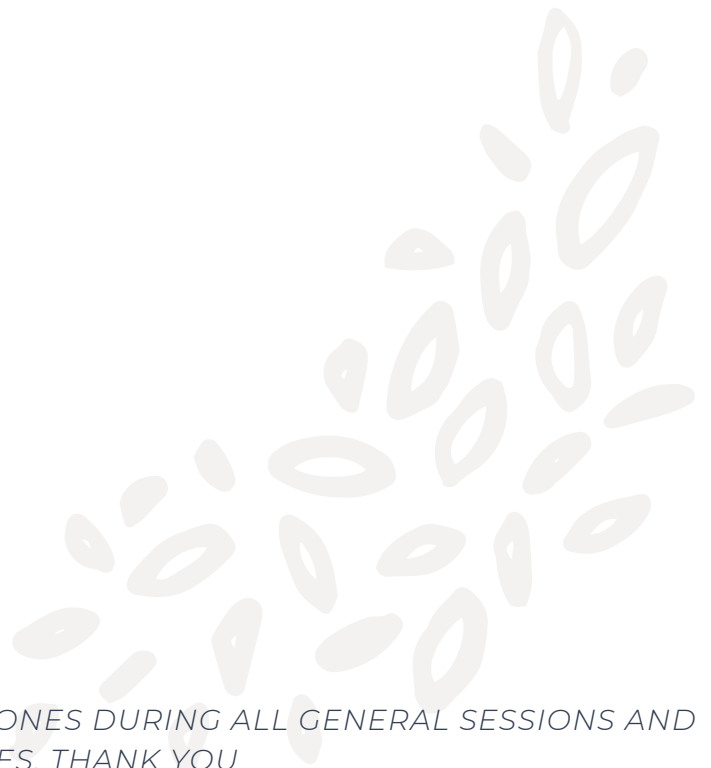

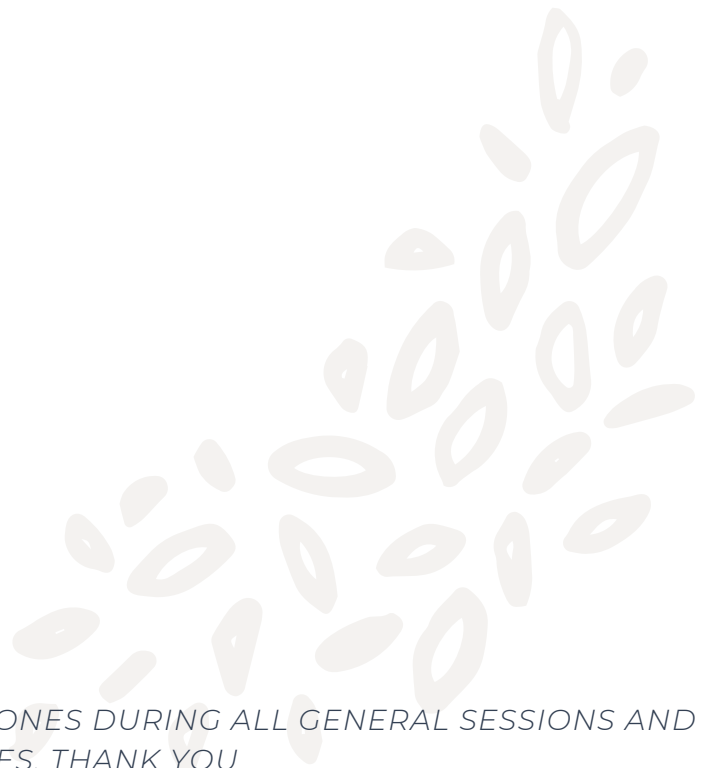

The church planting group helps churches plant multiplying churches by partially funding but fully supporting church planting apprentices and church planters, as well as supporting multilingual ministries.

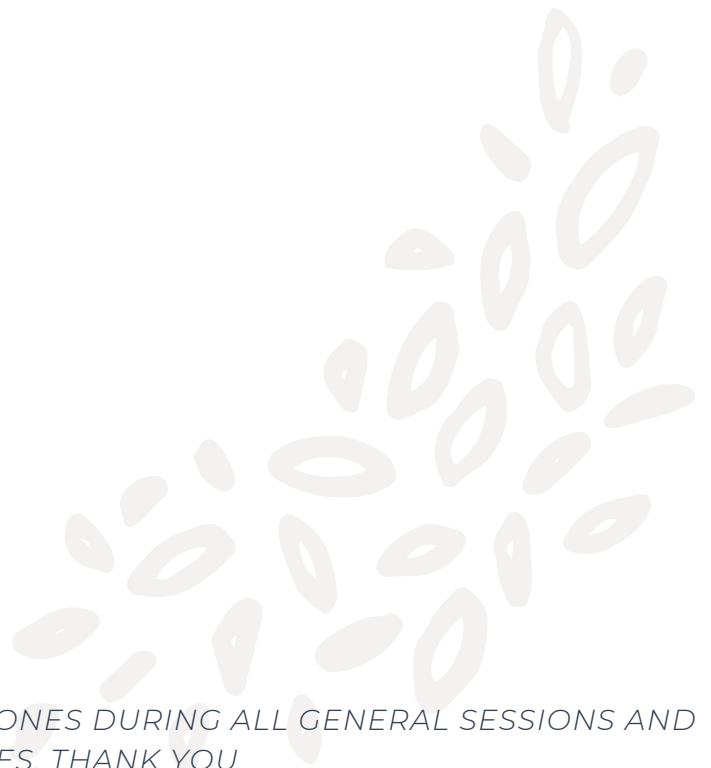
