FROM THE OFFICE OF THE Executive Director-Treasurer

The Apostle Paul shared a unique perspective of God in Ephesians 3 as he prayed to the Lord on behalf of the believers in Ephesus. He described God's "immeasurable" ability to work beyond our prayers, thoughts, and even dreams.

In 2022, God worked immeasurably more than I could have ever prayed, hoped or dreamed.

He was at work when natural staff changes left gaps in job assignments. BUT GOD, in all His sovereignty brought the right people at the right time. He guided us through the learning curve of new processes and training new staff, and I cannot wait to see what He has in store for our team in the future. **Great things are ahead for Kentucky WMU.**

I saw God at work in our local churches and associations. As I attended associational/network meetings with Cristian County, Owen Association, Elkhorn, Lake Cumberland, I saw ordinary people being used to plant churches, train up children to live on mission, and equip women for their unique role in the Great Commission. I met with women from Anchor Baptist Church, Main Street Baptist Church, and the CWJC in Hopkinsville, and heard story after story of **people stepping out of their comfort zones to share the gospel.**

At the Women's World Day of Prayer at Buck Creek Baptist Church, I joined hands to pray for Baptist women around the world who are running the race in areas where persecution is a real thing. **God is still at work bringing people to Himself despite of their circumstances.**

In partnership with my WMU sisters, I had the opportunity to help Alabama WMU at their first Hispanic Women's Event. We introduced the work of WMU and trained Pastor and their Wives about how WMU can strengthen the whole church to fulfill the Great Commission. I also joined like-structured WMU Executive Directors for a time of brainstorming and troubleshooting ministry issues. We were joined by Sandy Wisdom-Martin for **much needed encouragement and mental health care.**

By God's grace, I was given an opportunity to sit on a panel with National WMU leaders and pastors in Anaheim, California at the Southern Baptist Convention, as we spoke about the importance of WMU in the Church on the Cooperative Program Mainstage. I also joined Sandy Wisdom-Martin and President Connie Dixon, on a webinar with the Bivocational & Small Church Leadership Network to discuss the benefits of WMU in a small church. My summer activities ended, with an experience I will never forget. I was invited to attend the International Mission Board Affinity Group Meeting for NAME. I enjoyed connecting with our prayer advocates, hearing gospel stories, and getting to build relationships with missionaries. **A new M -friend reminds me often that "Prayer is the work". Keep praying WMU!**

God has been so gracious to provide more opportunities to serve with KBC. I was invited to serve on the Every Church on Mission workgroup that planned the missional emphasis for the year. WMU resources were included and promoted as key tools to help churches take their next step in missions. I served as a speaker for the Women's Track at REACH, a workshop leader for collegiate women at Converge, and as the MC at Connect.

I always say "the Lord is at work and I'm just along for the ride". Are you?



Christian Women's Job Corps celebrated 25 years of transformational ministry. Beginning in 1997, CWJC has collectively served 67,228 participants, utilized 198,198 volunteers, and has celebrated 5,622 professions of Faith.

Kentucky WMU celebrated with CWJC Executive Director Arlene Miller, volunteers, and participants of the CWJC in Hopkinsville.

They have faithfully provided skill building activities like sewing, Bible Study, computer skills, and the like for the last 18 years. They have consistently served at least 20 participants each year of ministry.

Compassion Ministries *Kentucky Changers*

We knew God was moving in the worship services in Shelbyville. The altars were full at invention time; we'd had several conversations with group leaders on what they were sensing, how God was moving, and some decisions they were being made. But we were overwhelmed by the response we got the night when Steve Coleman, our project pastor (and Minister to Youth & Families at First Baptist Church in Richmond) gave the appeal, "if you are dealing with a call to ministry, I need you to stand and meet us in the hallway out back". Twenty people, TWENTY, almost 10% of those participating in worship that night, stood up and walked out into the hallway to say they were dealing with a call to ministry. As they gathered, I looked at the group. There were teenagers, young adults, and middle-aged adults, male and female, from churches across Kentucky. We gathered their contact information (for follow-up), gave them some resources, and prayed over them. That night will remain as one of my highlights from 30 years of working with Changers.

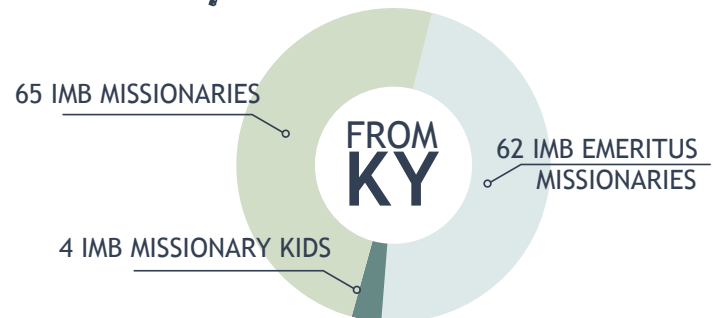

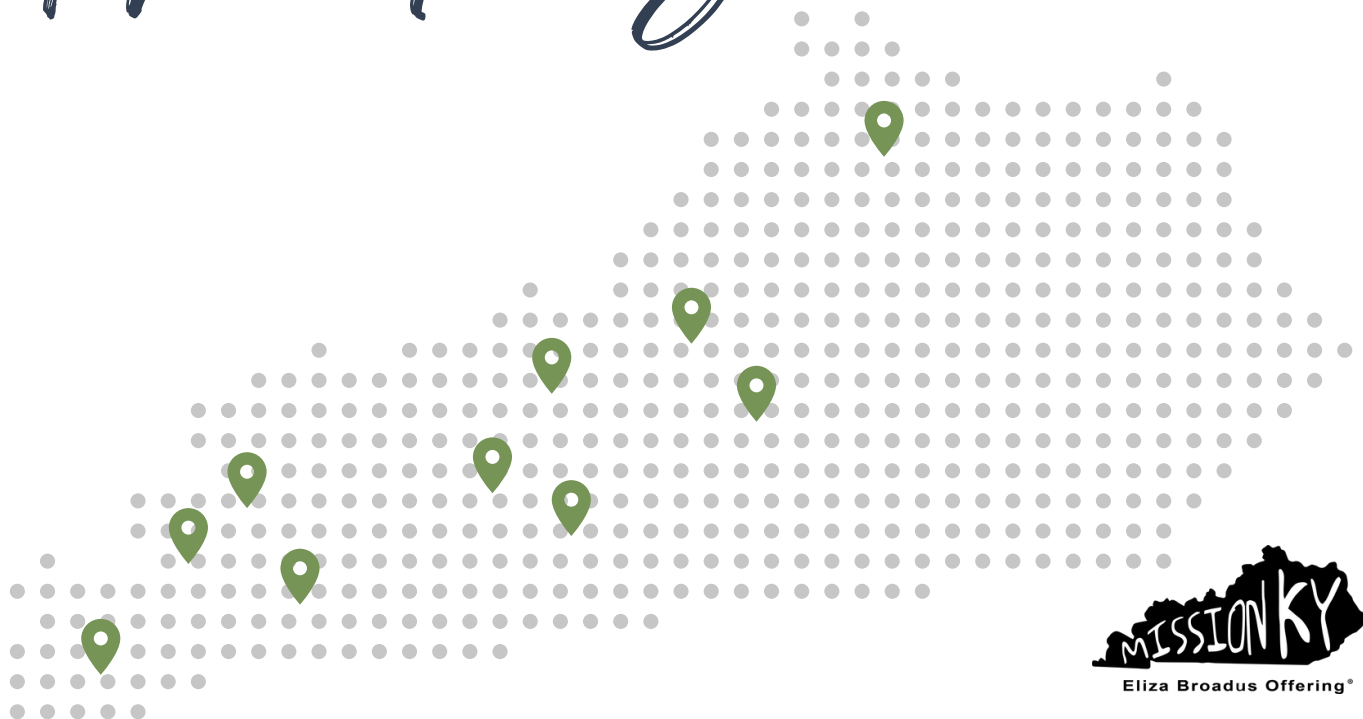

KENTUCKY DR BLESSED WITH HEART FUND GRANT

Grants from the HEART Fund allow Baptists to provide direct relief and rebuilding assistance to disaster victims in the United States and around the world.

When the devastating tornado hit Western/Central Kentucky in December of 2021, the HEART Fund helped Kentuckians get back on their feet. The WMU Foundation gifted Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief with \$27,000 to help during clean up.

Funds were used to purchase food & drinks for DR teams, fuel for vehicles to transport equipment to relief sites, and funded one full week of chainsaw work in Freemont.

The HEART Fund gift also helped in Bowling Green and surrounding area our teams served two full weeks and we provided heavy equipment. Kentucky Baptist DR was able secure transport of their new machine “Kermit” (compact wheel loader) and skid steer, and feed the Bowling Green team as they worked on area houses.



HELPING ASSOCIATIONS MEET THE NEED

In addition to the grant for the Kentucky Baptist DR ministry, the WMU Foundation gave another grant to Kentucky WMU to help Associations in impacted areas. Kentucky WMU received \$8,000 with the intent to help Associations purchase gift cards to help those in need.

As AMS would engage their communities, local church members, and pastors, they quickly realized gift cards were the biggest need to help people get back on their feet after the tornados. Whether they need resources from a lumber, grocery, convenience store or the like, a gift card to help soothe a distraught heart or open the door for a gospel conversation.
